

**Potawatomi Online Class
Intermediate Level Course
(Bodéwadmimwen 201)**

By the end of this course, the student should be able to:

1. Pass a Written Exam on the concepts listed above at 75%
2. Give a 14 point introduction of him/herself AND someone else.
3. Recite a long prayer
4. Be able to tell the day of the week, month, time of day, and current weather.
5. Be able to write a short paragraph describing an event, and be able to read it aloud.
